## Notice of Intention

### Colchester Borough Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2019 - A

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the Colchester Borough Council intends under powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to make the Colchester Borough Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2019-A which provides as follows:

- 1 The Colchester Borough Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2019 - A ("the Order") replaces the Colchester (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2018-C ("the Original Order").
- 2 The Original Order is to be revoked.
- 3 The Order relates to the following Parking Places:  
**Colchester:** Sheepen Road Lorry and Coach Park, Vineyard Street, Priory Street, Britannia, Sheepen Road, Town Hall car park, Osbourne Street permit surface car park, Middleborough, Napier Road North, Napier Road South, St. John's, St. Mary's, Prettygate Road, St. Christopher Road, Butt Road, Old Heath Road, The Recreation Ground car park at Port Lane, Leisure World, Leisure World car park B car park. St. Julian Grove, Alexandra Terrace, Walsingham Road, Bergholt Road, Three Crowns Road, Sanderson Mews, West Stockwell, Stockwell, Maidenburgh Street, Atlee Gardens, Ken Cooke Court Area A & Area B resident parking areas.  
**Myland:** High Woods Country Park. **Great Horkesley:** Ramparts Close, **Lexden:** London Road car park. **Dedham:** Mill Lane car and lorry park & Mill Pond car park. **West Mersea:** Victoria Esplanade, Willoughby Park, Seaview Avenue, Coast Road, The Town Hard surface area & High Street car parks. **Wivenhoe:** Cooks Yard A car park, Cooks Yard B car park and High Street car park.
- 4 The general effect of the Order is as follows:
  - a. To introduce the Town Hard surface area (off Coast Road West Mersea) into the Order
  - b. To introduce no waiting at any time restrictions onto the Town Hard surface area
  - c. To introduce Loveurcar parking bay definition into the Order
  - d. To amend section 3.13 of the order to read "If at any time when a vehicle is left in a pay and display parking place during the charging hours there is no ticket machine or other form of payment type (ie virtual permit solution) available, the driver of that vehicle shall be exempt from purchasing a parking ticket during the charging hours for up to the maximum period of stay in the parking place."
