Find some swans and cygnets. Did you know that baby swans are called cygnets? Have you ever read the ugly duckling, it's all about a cygnet!



Look under leaves to find caterpillars and up in the sky for butterflies or moths? Did you find any eggs or chrysalis? This photo is of an Orange Tip butterfly.



All trees have a life cycle and must spread their seeds. Can you find some trees that use the wind or animals to spread their seed? This photo is of an acorn from an Oak Tree.



We tend to look for animals, but you can often hear animals as well. Listen carefully to hear crickets singing. Where do crickets live?



Explore Hollytrees Lawn in upper Castle Park and stroll around the sensory garden. What games do you think those living in Hollytrees played here?



Visit The Folly in Castle Park. The archway was built by Charles Gray in the 1700s, though it looks much older! Use your imagination - why do you think this was built?
