Introduction

As part of the ongoing 'town bid' proposal and recent launch of the partnership working group, it was decided to hold a small consultation to seek initial public opinion to establish how local people feel about Colchester in order to shape early direction of the project.

An online survey was designed and launched on Friday 7 February 2020, closing on Tuesday 3 March 2020.

The survey obtained 216 responses. The data has been analysed, categorised and presented below.

It should be noted that due to the survey mainly consisting of open-textbox questions, the answers have had to be themed in order to show common views, ideas and concerns.

Survey Findings

Q1. What does 'Colchester Town' mean to you?

Respondents were asked to describe what the words 'Colchester Town' mean to them. The answers to this question have been categorised to show common themes, feelings and concerns.

There were a variety of topics discussed, however some views were shared by many.

63 people expressed feelings of 'strong heritage and history', with many mentioning Colchester being 'Britain's first roman capital'.


57 respondents stated that 'Colchester Town' means 'my home', with many individuals demonstrating a sense of belonging within Colchester.

18 people stated that for them 'Colchester Town' represents 'a declining, dismal and rundown town'. Members of this group also mentioned concerns with crime, lack of investment and excessive development.

17 participants stated that they associate 'Colchester Town' with 'good shopping'.

10 respondents discussed a connection between 'Colchester Town' and 'too much traffic, congestion and pollution'.

Q2. What makes Colchester Town a great place to live, work, visit or study?

Respondents were asked 'what makes Colchester a great place to live, work, visit or study.

In order to identify common themes, feelings and opinions, the answers to this question have been categorised below.

Colchester's 'historical importance' was the most common answer given (52 people). 'Good facilities' was the next most popular answer (31 people) and Colchester 'castle and park' was the third top answer given (28 people).

Top 5 Suggestions

- 1. Tackle issues with traffic management / reduce congestion (30 people)
- Better public transport services and connections (for examples trams)
 (29 people)
- 3. Promote/preserve history and heritage(24 people)

- 4. Stop building so many houses and large developments(23 people)
- 5. Provide more support for independent businesses and retailers (21 people)



Demographic Profile

Below is a brief demographic profile of those individuals who completed the 'We Are Colchester' survey.


When looking at the address locations of respondents, it was clear that most people came from postcodes in and around Colchester. The most common postcodes were CO1, CO2, CO3, CO4, CO5, CO6 and CO7. However, there were also respondents from Harwich, Manningtree, Witham, Maldon, Sudbury, Clacton, Ipswich, and Halstead.

The majority (62%) of respondents were 'female', 31% were 'male' and 6.9% selected 'prefer not to say'.


The largest age groups represented were '46 to 55 years' (27.8%), '56 to 65 years' (9.9%) and '36 to 45 years' (16.7%).


85.8% of respondents recorded themselves as being 'white'. The remainder were split between 'mixed' (1.9%), 'Chinese' (0.5%), 'other ethnic group' (0.5%) and 'prefer not to say' (10.6%).


Postcodes:











Recommendations

Based on the above findings I have made some initial recommendations for areas that could be explored further. These are only my initial thoughts based on the knowledge I have gained from reading through the comments. However, there are a lot of other issues, concerns and ideas that have been raised which will also need consideration.

There were also various topics raised that were not necessarily in scope for this project, for example:

- Volume of housing development in Colchester
- Road infrastructure
- Public transport improvements
- Crime levels and policing
- Healthcare

History

Look at how Colchester's historical importance can be incorporated into the 'town bid project'. It is clear from the survey results that many residents are passionate about the town's history and connection with the Romans. Can more be done to promote and celebrate Colchester's history...

Investigate how the project can help tackle issues with congestion and traffic flow through the town centre. Traffic, congestion and the idea of pedestrianization were mentioned throughout the survey.

Independen

Look a providing additional support for independent retailers. Throughout the survey there was a lot of support for independent retailers, with many respondents stating a dislike of chain-stores and the current mix of retail stores available within Colchester. Another suggestion that was frequently raised in connect to this was 'revising business rates'.
