CBH Outreach Team Receives High Commendation

Homeless Link's annual award scheme celebrates the best of the homelessness and supported housing sectors. The Innovative Housing category recognizes organizations that creatively increase access to suitable, affordable housing, which is critical for preventing and resolving homelessness, especially in the face of a chronic housing shortage.

This year, 149 entries were received across various categories, and 30 organizations were shortlisted, including the CBH Outreach Team. We are happy to share that the team has been Highly Commended in the Homeless Link Innovation in Housing Excellence Award!

Visit to Braintree Foyer

Recently, we had the chance to visit Braintree Foyer and learn more about the work they do. The facility offers supported housing for individuals aged 18-35 with low-level support needs, featuring 35 bed spaces. Each resident is assigned a key worker, and notably, most of the support workers have lived experience, with some having previously lived in the Foyer themselves. This unique perspective enhances the support they provide. The support goes beyond tenancy assistance, with programs shaped by client feedback, including training for aspiring support workers, an LGBTQ group, Braintree's first Pride event, and a neurodiversity group called NeuroSpice. The facility includes amenities like an on-site gym, music room, and a garden maintained by the tenants. Residents live in clusters of rooms with shared kitchen and bathroom facilities and can stay for up to two years, with flexibility as needed. Frontline Network Offers Training Fund

The Frontline Network is pleased to announce the availability of a Training Fund designed to support frontline workers and teams assisting people experiencing homelessness. For those who have identified a training course that will enhance their work but lack the necessary funding from their organization, this fund provides a valuable resource.

About the Training Fund

- Individual Grants: Workers can apply for up to £500 to cover the cost of training.
- Group Grants: Teams can apply for up to £1,500.


The Training Fund was established in 2019 in response to feedback from the annual survey, aiming to help frontline staff access essential training to better support their work with the homeless community.

Application Process

The Frontline Network aims to make the Training Fund as accessible as possible. Applicants can complete the process via a call with a team member if preferred. Interested individuals should contact the team to arrange this.

HOUSING SOLUTIONS

The Homelessness Reduction Act (HRA) became law on the 3 April 2018. It changes how we help people who are – or may become – homeless within the next 56 days. We will work with you where possible to prevent you from becoming homeless, and to reduce the need for temporary or emergency housing.

The type and level of help depends upon your personal situation, but we'll always provide you with advice and assistance wherever possible.

You can complete a 10-minute online assessment (Enhanced Housing Options Wizard) which will provide advice and guidance tailored to your current situation. It will give you the next steps that you should take to address your current situation and if you are homeless or threatened with homeless in 56 days and are unable to help yourself you will be able to self-book an appointment with a Housing Solutions Officer at a date and time to suit your needs.

If you do not have access to a smart phone/computer and/or the internet you can contact the Housing Solutions Team on 01206 580290 Monday – Friday 9am – 5pm, who will provide you with advice and assistance on how to book an appointment. In the Colchester area we have asked all our partners to automatically refer their customers to us if they meet the criteria and assist them where needed to complete the EHO.

If you are unable to complete the online assessment and are already engaged with services, you may be able to complete this with the assistance of your support worker. Some public bodies will also have a duty to notify the Council if they are aware that you are threatened with homelessness within 56 days or are currently homeless.

If you have not got a support worker, you can telephone our customer service centre on 01206 282569 to find out where you can find support to enable you to complete this form and any enquires about accessing the housing solutions service.

CBH Cake Sale Supports Women's Aid 50th Anniversary

In July, Women's Aid celebrated their 50th anniversary, and CBH marked this milestone by hosting a cake sale to raise funds for the charity. A dedicated group of DA Champions and staff members baked enthusiastically, raising £267. According to Refuge, domestic abuse is alarmingly common in the UK, profoundly affecting survivors' mental health, physical wellbeing, and family safety. Statistics reveal that the police receive a domestic abuse-related call every 30 seconds, yet only about 24% of such crimes are reported. Additionally, 1 in 4 women in England and Wales will experience domestic abuse in their lifetime, highlighting the pervasive and isolating nature of this issue.

Workshop Highlights

Your Own Place's workshops provide comprehensive knowledge on money management, housing, and tenancy, along with practical training skills and engagement techniques. These sessions inspire participants to support tenants and residents more effectively.

Feedback from Participants

Emily Goodbody from CBH Outreach Team reflected on the interactive nature of the training: "This training is all about participation and getting involved. There were lots of group discussions and opportunities to share our thoughts. It's very visual, which is great for promoting solution-focused practices and sparking conversations on how to enhance our work ethic. The 'Train the Trainer' workshop invites you to reevaluate your values, focusing on what is important for you, your team, and your organization. We identified that our core values are Asset-based, Restorative, Choice, Kindness, and Self-care. Upholding these values helps us feel that we are doing our best for our clients, team, friends, and families. I would 100% recommend these sessions. They offer valuable insights and practical skills that enhance our ability to provide kindness, support, choice, and asset-based solutions to our clients."

A CALL TO ACTION ON WORLD HOMELESS DAY

As the world marks World Homeless Day on October 10th, it's imperative to shed light on the growing homelessness crisis in the UK. Despite efforts by various charities and organizations, the situation is worsening, with a significant rise in core homelessness projected for the immediate future.

According to Crisis charity's baseline forecasts, core homelessness is set to increase significantly in the coming years. By 2024, overall core homelessness is expected to be one fifth higher than 2020 levels. The drivers behind this increase are manifold. Inflation is squeezing real incomes, leading to increasing poverty and destitution. Additionally, rising private rents and evictions, along with declining social rented lettings, contribute to this alarming trend.

The latest figures from Crisis highlight the severity of the situation. An estimated 3,898 people were counted as sleeping rough across England on a single night in autumn 2023. This represents a staggering increase of more than a quarter compared to the 3,069 people counted in 2022 and is more than double the 1,768 people recorded in 2010.

The majority of those sleeping rough in England are male, aged over 26, and from the UK. According to the Office for National Statistics, men living on the streets outnumber women at a ratio of six to one. Furthermore, the number of households living in temporary accommodation in England has reached an all-time high. As of the end of 2023, 112,660 households were living in temporary accommodation, including 146,800 children.

Public awareness of homelessness as a serious problem in the UK is growing, according to a poll carried out in January 2023 by Ipsos Mori and the Centre for Homelessness Impact. Of the 2,152 UK adults surveyed, three-quarters said they expected the issue to worsen in the country over the next 12 months.

However, there are misconceptions surrounding homelessness. While many believe that those experiencing homelessness are predominantly affected by alcohol or drug dependency, the reality is different. Even among rough sleepers, this is not the case.

Moreover, there remains a stigma around homelessness. A recent poll by the homelessness charity House of St Barnabas found that 70% of Brits don't consider unsuitable accommodation a form of homelessness, despite lacking a secure place to live fitting the definition of statutory homelessness. Less than half of those surveyed considered sofa-surfing or staying with relatives or friends as homelessness. Shockingly, 82% admitted they wouldn't know what to do if they found out someone, they knew was homeless.

As we mark World Homeless Day, it's crucial to acknowledge the growing crisis of homelessness in the UK. It's not just a matter of statistics; behind every number is a human story. The time has come for concerted action to tackle this issue and ensure that everyone has a place to call home. If you know someone who is sleeping rough, please raise an alert via StreetLink.
