Danger of being identified as one the "other villages" is that we are not protected by the principle of sustainable development set out in the local plan, so enhanced description is required for Copford with Easthorpe as an "other village".

Other Villages are defined by tightly drawn settlement boundaries which reflect the core community focus of each village and protect the intrinsiccharacter and beauty of the countryside. Other Villages can accommodate alimited amount of small scale development and the policy context setting out thetypes of development considered appropriate is set out in policy OV1. LP p 15
