Purpose

To give a response to Colchester Borough Council on the Site Allocations Submission Consultation.

Recommendation

The Standing Committee is asked to consider:

That the comments in Appendix A constitute the Assembly's response to this consultation and the Colchester Borough Council Site Allocations Submission document is in general conformity with the East of England Plan.

1. Introduction

- 1.1 Colchester Borough Council has published its Site Allocations Document for Submission under Regulation 27 of the Town and Country Planning Act (Local Development) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2008.
- 1.2 Consultation on the previous stage (Regulation 25) of the document was conducted over January - February 2009. The consultation document was considered to be in general conformity with the adopted East of England Plan by the RPP Standing Committee on 20 February 2009.

2. Background

- 2.1 The Borough of Colchester lies within the Haven Gateway, which is a major focus for economic development and growth. The Gateway is a key location between the UK and mainland Europe, with access to the rest of Europe via the nearby ports of Harwich and Felixstowe to the east and Stansted Airport to the west.
- 2.2 The town of Colchester is the centre of the Borough, and for a the wider area of North East Essex. Residents of Braintree and Tendring districts travelling into the town for employment, retail and leisure facilities. The character of the Borough is also influenced by the countryside, urban green spaces, and smaller historic settlements such as Stanway, Tiptree, West Mersea, Wivenhoe, Dedham, and Rowhedge.

2.3 The East of England Plan indicates that the Borough should provide a minimum of 17,100 new dwellings and contribute to provision of 20,000 new jobs in the Essex part of the Haven Gateway between 2001 and 2021.

3. Regional context

3.1 Regional planning policy for Colchester Borough Council is contained in the adopted East of England Plan. In assessing this consultation document, all policies within the Regional Spatial Strategy were considered.

3.2 The Colchester Borough Council Core Strategy was adopted in December 2008.

4. Comments

4.1 The Colchester Borough Council Site Allocations Submission Document has addressed an appropriate range of policy topics to secure the implementation of the East of England Plan. The DPD is clearly presented and relates well to the Council's Submission Proposals Maps; the policies elucidate local issues and respond well to the Regional Spatial Strategy.

5. Recommendations

5.1 The Standing Committee is asked to consider that the comments in Appendix A constitute the Assembly's response to this consultation, and the Colchester Borough Council Site Allocations Submission document is in general conformity with the East of England Plan.
